




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# Summer is Here

Dear all,

We hope you are keeping safe and well in this difficult climate.

Everyone is working hard to do everything possible to keep residents and staff safe.

Relevant authorities have updated official guidance regularly. Although unfortunately guidance has sometimes been conflicting and confusing, the most up to date, accurate and relevant information has been cascaded effectively to our teams. Appropriate training according to staff roles has been made available and fully utilised.

We have demonstrated a proactive approach from the outset of the pandemic taking the difficult decision to close our doors allowing only essential visitation to take place a week before the government-imposed lockdown measures. Residents are being cared for in their rooms to minimise the risk of transmission, we are following isolation guidance for new and existing residents, as well as staff. Residents are being screened on an ongoing basis for signs of infection so that appropriate action can be taken as soon as possible should an individual present with symptoms.

All staff and residents have now been tested for COVID – 19 and we are still awaiting some results. Every effort has been made to ensure that our team is adequately protected with required Personal

Protective Equipment (PPE) on an ongoing basis and plans have been implemented to ensure that we are able to quarantee safe staffing levels.

As the country may be preparing for a relaxation of some of the restrictive measures put in place for the general public, it is crucial to acknowledge that this would result in higher risk of transmission to our residents. The increase of contact and interaction in the general population will increase the risk of the virus transferring. Our restrictions will need to remain through this high-risk period. We are mindful that our residents have not been able to enjoy visits for a long period of time. We also appreciate how hard it is to not be able to visit. We appreciate your ongoing support and understanding. We will be keeping abreast with guidance and will share any changes put in place as they happen.


