We are so pleased to see so many of you visiting your loved ones following government restrictions being lifted. I know that it has taken some time for us to get back to some form of normalcy.

I am also aware that it has been some time since we had a catch up with families collectively. We would like to share with you some of the things we have been up to as a home:

- 1. We were nominated for Best Care Team London Region for the Great British Care Awards, We are extremely proud of the staff and the efforts that they have put in to collaborate and support the wider community and engage with them to ensure that the residents and staff wellbeing was kept up at a really difficult time.
- 2. We are now heading into another round of Gold Standards Framework accreditation. There has been a lot of hard work that has gone into making End of Life care the best it can be especially in the first peak of the COVID-19 pandemic where several our residents died. Each life matters and to celebrate their legacy we will be holding a candlelight vigil at Priscilla Wakefield House. We will update everyone on the date and time of the event if you wish to participate.
- 3. We are now a Teaching Care Home and our focus on Diabetes care has been nationally recognised. We were also able to work in collaboration with our local hospitals such as Whittington Health to gain support for our staff in understanding more about Diabetes and formulating protocols for both Hyper and Hypoglycemia. We just want to say how much this has impacted reduction in hospital admissions for residents living with diabetes in our care setting.
- 4. We continue to strive for excellence and where this is not achieved, we want to put things right and will support in any way we can to ensure that both you and your loved ones are happy with the care and support provided. This can only be attained if we work in collaboration with each other. We are happy to have your feedback, comments, suggestions and work with you to make this home the best place to live and a family where you feel supported and loved. WE CAN DO THIS TOGETHER!

Lastly – I just want to say thank you for your resilience at a really difficult time and for persevering with us in keeping infection control procedures going such as wearing of PPE, facemasks and continuing to follow the guidelines as per the protocols at the reception.
