Here at Priscilla Wakefield House, our residents are family! So a few key things coming up:

1. We are registered as a Gold Standard care home for end of life care and we are going for re-accreditation this year. We would love to hear your thoughts on how you feel we continue to support you with Advance Care planning, LPA referencing, DNACPR discussions and getting through the death and dying process. We usually send out surveys when a loved one dies to gain an understanding of how we can improve and the feedback has been positive with a few learning actions that we have already put in place.

2. We will be starting the refurbishment this April 2023 and would love your suggestions and input. This project is for all communal areas, lounges, dining rooms to make them come to life again.

3. We will be hosting the National Care Home Open week at our Nursing Home this year and the launch event will be taking place at Priscilla Wakefield House. We would love for you to join in the fun and to share your own experiences and that of your loved ones to our dignitaries. The care home open week will run from 27th June to 3rd July 2023.

4. For World Book day this year we wanted to make it fun for the residents and staff so we are holding a Mad hatters tea party on Thursday 2nd March and staff and residents are asked to dress up in their Mad Hatters costumes where we will be holding a judging competition at 11am.

5. We would like to host the 1st relatives meeting on 20th March 2023 in our multi-function room at 5pm where we provide light snacks and drinks. Please make an effort to attend this meeting so we can share some changes that has taken place within the NHS that is affecting residents obtaining ambulance services and what you can do to reclaim funds that you may need to use to fund their transportation to and from appointments. We will also discuss dental and podiatry support for your loved ones so don't miss it. We hope to see you all there.

We look forward to continuing our journey with you and fostering good relationship centered care where your loved ones are at the heart of everything we do.

Interviews

Meet Leleka, Nurse Associate

Hello Leleka please share with us your journey working at PWH.

I have been working at Priscilla Wakefield House since 2009 and I feel like part of the furniture.

My health care profession started back home in the Caribbean where I worked as a theatre nurse. I started in 1994. Four years into my profession I came to the UK in 1998. Then I was working at Jewish Care on Bishops Avenue until I had my son in 2000, after that I worked part time until I moved somewhere closer. After that I applied as a Health Care Assistant, and I got it in 2009 and I started at Priscilla Wakefield House on nights for a year and then eventually I started working day shifts. I have met lots of lovely nurses, lovely HCAs, and management. As the years go by the team changed, management team changed, health care assistant teams changed. After several years I have become a team leader. I worked on all the units at PWH. I was getting to know every resident. It is good to move from unit to unit to get a background history of different types of residents that are admitted to PWH. After I moved from team leader to unit manager on Nickleby unit where I was managing for a couple of years and then because of my nursing background they invited me to study as a Nursing Associate. I went to the Uni for 18 months and I have completed. I have a registered pin under Nursing Associate as it is a recognised body now.

Like a friendly atmosphere. I like to integrate and communicate with the residents; I like to make them laugh and support them in their activities of daily living. And, to have that good communication. I like everybody, from activities to housekeeping to kitchen staff. I like the whole holistic thing about one team one dream, and everybody is involved with everyone.

What I like the least about working at PWH is not seeing an individual being cared for the way in which he or she needs to be cared for. You have a duty of care and you signed that you can offer these types of care but in the end, you meet the person halfway instead of full way. I like when everybody puts their hearts and soul to make that individual feel safe, feel comfortable and so the person can trust the person giving them that quality of life, to assure them that it is safe, you are in safe hands, and you are going to be cared for holistically. You have people who only work for the money and then you have the people who chose this job because they have that caring concept and duty of care.


Games on Nickleby


Celebrating Valentine's Day
